

A Trip Down Memory Lane

Bembridge Beach By Katherine Sutton For ATDML



Supplies

- October Afternoon Cakewalk – Candy Buttons, Sugar Stix, Paper Straws and Gift Wrap
- Bazzil Kraft cardstock – 2 sheets
- Fancy Pants Summers End stickers
- October Afternoon Mini Market stickers
- Cream Buttons
- White Gesso
- Tea dye distress ink
- Stapler and sewing machine
- 3 photos (or 1 6 by 4 and however many you can fit in the pocket!)

1. Start by cutting the Sugar Stix (star burst paper) 8" by 5 1/2" – I centred the photo around the star shape. Go around the edge of the paper with a make up sponge and tea dye distress ink, or use Tim Holtz's inking tool. Then stitch around the edge too, or you could draw on sewing with a white gel pen.
2. Cut a piece of kraft cardstock for the photo mount 6 1/2" by 5" (my photo shows a piece slightly larger). To



make the tab, either draw around a chipboard tab or file divider, or if not draw a line 1/2" down from the top of the cardstock, measure 1/2" from the right hand side and mark on the 1/2" line, then mark 2 3/4" in from the edge on that 1/2" line. On the top edge mark 3/4" from the right hand side and then 2 1/2" in from the right

hand side. Join the 1/2" and 3/4" lines together and the same with the 2 1/2" and 2 3/4" lines on the other side to make the tab. So you should have something that looks like the above, to cut out – don't stick the photo down yet. Ink and stitch around the edge.


3. To make the tabs for the other photos; start by cutting a 1" strip of the Sugar Stix paper and 5" strip of kraft cardstock. Stick the 1" along the top of the kraft. At this stage I stuck my 2 extra photos on the kraft cardstock so that I could line up the tabs my photos were approx. 3.5" by 4". Use the tab we made in the previous step as a template to add a tab to each of these photos set one to the middle and another to the right, so they will be




layered behind each other on the final page. Again ink and stitch around the edges once you have cut it all out.

4. Cut a small flag from the B side of the Sugar stix paper, and then cut out the numbers 1, 2 and 3 from the gift wrap paper, layer the 1 on the little flag. Ink the edges of all of them, and then staple them to the 3 tabs in the order you want the photos.
5. Using a 1" circle punch, punch out 28 1" circles from a mixture of the Candy Buttons, Paper Straws and Gift wrap papers. Next cut out a square template to use in the paper folding – I used a piece of card the thickness of that from a cereal box, and cut it 1" square.





6. Line up the square in the middle of the circle and then fold up the edges. Once they are all done remove the square and do the same to all the others.
7. Stick you main kraft tab(where your photo will go) onto the Sugar Stix paper – only sticking it around 3 sides so you leave a pocket in the top.
8. Next stick this piece onto your kraft cardstock 1 ¼” from the top and 2” from each side. Then start to arrange all the folded circles underneath .I added them in a random order and left spaces for 4 cream buttons, which I threaded with string. Once you are happy with the arrangement, stick it all down.
9. Water down some white gesso, so it will flick nicely off your brush, try on a scrap piece of paper before hand as if you water it too much then it becomes very transparent, not enough and it won't drip. Add flicks to the top left and bottom right corners of the page. Once you have done this you can stick your main photo on.
10. Use the alphabets to make your title and you can add any journaling on the back of the extra photo tabs.
